London Legacy Development Corporation Community Infrastructure Levy Report for Financial Year 2016/17 (Regulation 62 Report)



The Legacy Corporation is required to prepare a report for any financial year ("the reported year") in which it collects CIL. The charging authority must publish the report on its website no later than 31st December following the end of the reported year. This report has been prepared to meet the requirement of this regulation.

The Legacy Corporation started charging its CIL on the 6th April 2015. As a charging authority in London it is also responsible for collecting the Mayor of London's CIL charge, which is then passed to Transport for London which subsequently administers the Mayoral CIL, including its spending.

During the financial year 2016/17 £3,284,253.12 of LLDC CIL and £4,285,979.31 of Mayoral CIL was collected. An allocation from the LLDC CIL of £1 million was made towards the costs of the Hackney Wick Station Project (provision of underpass and rebuilding works) and is due to be claimed towards costs incurred in 2017.

The Legacy Corporation is required to spend 15% of collected CIL monies in consultation with its local community. During 2016/17 the 15% of the total LLDC CIL monies collected is \pounds **492,367.97**. It is anticipated that an initial bidding round for projects to access funding from this Neighbourhood CIL Priorities Fund will be held during the latter part of 2017.

The Legacy Corporation, in accordance with the CIL Regulations 2010 (as amended) enable the collecting authority to retain 5% of the monies collected to use towards meeting the costs of administering its CIL. During the year 2016/17 this amount was **£164,212.66**. The equivalent amount for the Mayor of London's CIL Charge is 4% and in the year 2016/17 this amount was **£171,439.17**.

Table 1 below sets out the information that is required within a 'Regulation 62' report within that Regulation.

At the end of the financial year £1,714,093 remains to be paid in Legacy Corporation CIL as second instalments for schemes that have commenced and paid a first instalment within the year 2016/17.

In addition several schemes have received planning permission that have yet to commence and have had CIL liability notices issued. If commenced these could generate in the region of £680,000 in Legacy Corporation CIL payments.
