London Legacy Development Corporation Community Infrastructure Levy Report for Financial Year 2017/18 (Regulation 62 Report)



The Legacy Corporation is required to prepare a report for any financial year ("the reported year") in which it collects CIL. The charging authority must publish the report on its website no later than 31st December following the end of the reported year. This report has been prepared to meet the requirement of this regulation.

The Legacy Corporation started charging its CIL on the 6th April 2015. As a charging authority in London it is also responsible for collecting the Mayor of London's CIL charge, which is then passed to Transport for London which subsequently administers the Mayoral CIL, including its spending.

During the financial year 2017/18 £2,805,206.62 of LLDC CIL and £2,406,306.91 of Mayoral CIL was collected. An allocation from the LLDC CIL of £4 million was made towards the costs of the Hackney Wick Station Project and was claimed in the final quarter of 2017/18 towards overall project costs.

The Legacy Corporation is required to spend 15% of collected CIL monies in consultation with its local community. During 2017/18 the 15% of the total LLDC CIL monies collected is £420,781. An initial bidding round for projects to access funding from the Neighbourhood Priorities Fund will begin in June 2018.

The Legacy Corporation, in accordance with the CIL Regulations 2010 (as amended) enable the collecting authority to retain 5% of the monies collected to use towards meeting the costs of administering its CIL. During the year 2017/18 this amount was £140,260.33. The equivalent amount for the Mayor of London's CIL Charge is 4% and in the year 2017/18 this amount was £96,252.28.

Table 1 below sets out the information that is required within a 'Regulation 62' report within that Regulation.

At the end of the financial year £259,600.38 remains to be paid in Legacy Corporation CIL as second instalments for schemes that have commenced and paid a first instalment within the year 2017/18.
